MEMORANDUMS FOR TIME-CRITICAL REMOVAL  
ACTIONS AT FORMER INLAND BURN/RAILROAD  
SIDING EXCAVATION AREA AND GUAM WAY**

The Department of the Navy, in coordination with state (California Department of Toxic Substance Control and Regional Water Quality Control Board) and federal (U.S. Environmental Protection Agency) environmental regulatory agencies, announces the release of two Action Memorandums to perform Time-Critical Removal Actions at two sites at the former Naval Weapons Station (NAWPNSTA) Seal Beach Detachment Concord in Concord, California.

The Former Inland Burn/Railroad Siding Excavation Area (FIB/RSE) and Guam Way site are both located within the central portion of the Inland Area of the former NAWPNSTA Concord. FIB/RSE was used from the late 1940s through the 1970s to destroy ordnance and napalm by open burning. The Guam Way site contains buried trash and construction debris intermingled with material potentially presenting an explosive hazard. The Action Memorandums present summaries of investigations at each site as well as the Navy's plans to remove potential explosive hazards posed by munitions-related material buried at each site. During removal of munitions-related material, other debris and soil containing chemicals that pose potentially unacceptable risk to human health or the environment will also be removed.
